<p>Priorities for Funding</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To continue to provide high quality physical activity for all children across the range of ages and abilities. • To continue to provide children with access to additional sport-related after school activities • Through the use of a qualified coach, provide continuous CPD for teachers on planning and delivery of effective PE sessions. • To maintain the Sports Mark Gold accreditation award. Continuing to further increase the school’s participation in inter-school competition within the Middlesbrough School Sports Partnership and Tees Valley Sport.
<p>Summary of spending for 2022- 2023</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We provide one session of PE per week for each class led by a qualified coach. Maintaining robust PE assessment across school. • After school sports clubs continued to be tailored to link into the MSSP tournament timetable, so providing a greater variety of sporting opportunities and stimulating children’s interest in sport outside of school. • Mr Longstaff our qualified PE coach has actively sourced suitable local teams/clubs and encouraged children who are keen to attend these teams/clubs out of school hours (football, cricket, basketball, table tennis). Letters and contact number of these sports clubs/teams have been given to parents whose child shows flair and interest in these sports. • We have continued to provide free transport to and from inter-school sporting events. • We have continued to provide free team strips to all children participating in the inter school competitions so the children’s self-esteem is boosted along with a heightened ‘Beech Grove Family Team Spirit’ of togetherness. • Teachers continue to observe the sessions led by the PE coach and have been given detailed planning to follow for a second PE session. • New sporting equipment and kit were purchased to replace the existing equipment which was in a poor condition.

<p>Impact of PE and Sport Premium Funding</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • School were successful in applying for and maintaining the Sports Mark Gold Award for sporting excellence. • Due to the continued support and CPD delivered by the PE coach, teachers continue with confidence to deliver high quality PE sessions when the schools PE coach is offsite (i.e. taking teams to tournaments) • Assessment indicates that better quality PE teaching is continuing to improve children’s basic skill level. In the schools most recent OFSTED, Inspectors made very positive comments about the impact of improved PE teaching: <i>‘Leaders have established a well-planned curriculum. Specialist teaching in PE enhances the quality of teaching in this subject’</i> • Parents continue to comment favorably about their children’s enjoyment in PE. This is reflected in the after schools’ sports clubs and the high numbers that participate in them throughout the academic year. • Schools participation in inter school games continues to be at the required high standard to achieve Sports Mark Gold with high numbers of children representing the school. The school now regularly qualify for finals and win events/tournaments that we enter in to. The children are so excited to bring their trophies and medals back to school for all to celebrate in our weekly Celebration Assembly. • Of the 2022-23 Y5 cohort, 63% left the year group having attained at least a 25m swimming certificate. <p>Priorities for spending 2023-2024</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Continue to provide the high-quality PE teaching we have established with coach and teachers working together. • Continue to improve and build on successes/performance in inter-school sporting activities in order to foster cultural capital and promote British Values and what it is to be a good citizen in modern day Britain (i.e. fair play and healthy competition.) alongside Beech Grove ‘Next Door Neighbour Qualities (Respect, Tolerance and kindness) • To increase tournament participation for all pupils regardless of their ability by working collaboratively with the Youth Sport Trust (i.e. School Games) • Audit and supplement resources to increase the range of sporting activities on offer in school. • Continue to provide extension for talented children by building links with local sports clubs. • Continue to provide CPD for ASD base staff ensuring that children have the best possible inclusive physical education. • Where identified children from the ASD bases that display the emotional regulation required for mainstream PE will participate with their own year groups main stream class. • Continue the successful implementation of PE assessment procedures to measure impact. • To continue to successfully maintain the accreditation of Sports Mark Gold standard award from Youth Sport Trust in order to the apply for Platinum Standard (5 years period) • To offer a wider range of sporting opportunity to pupils outside of the ‘normal’ national curriculum (i.e. Golf Fore All, Martial Arts etc)
