

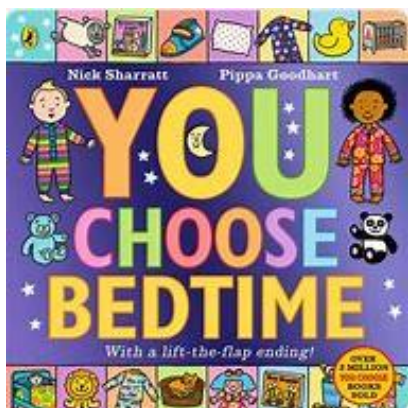

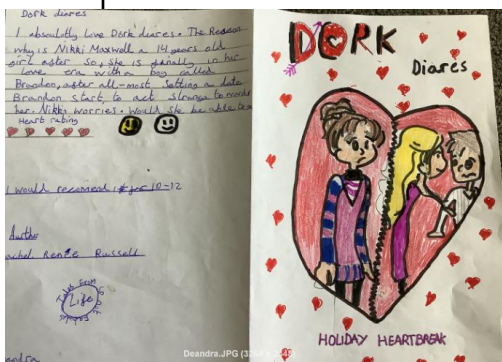
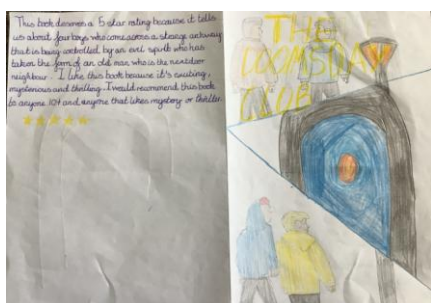
### VISITING AUTHORS
